## Notes - From The Frederick Post, "BABIES WIN GAME IN NINTH; TIMELY HITTING FEATURES...Yordy's Home Run In Eighth Registered Three: Victory In Eighth"

"Sensational and spectacular hitting cost the Hustlers the price of victory in Waynesboro. It was one of those eleventh hour uncertainties that tied the game in the eighth, and timely singles by Herrell and Ebert, plus a triple by Robinson nailed the game to the scoreboard on the "Babies" ball park."

Frederick was leading 4 to 1 going into the bottom of the eighth. Luke Kaunas walked, and Johnnie Blair beat out an infield hit to short. Yordy stepped up and crushed a Ramsey fastball over the Stern sign in left field for his fifth home run to knot the score at four. Walt Herrell took advantage of Ramsey's discomposure, and rapped a base hit on the first pitch he saw. Robinson followed with a drive to deep center that rolled to the fence, scoring Herrell with the go-ahead run, and landing "Robbie" on third with a triple. After an out, Ebert slapped a base hit in front of "Tubbie" Miller to tally Robinson with Waynesboro's fifth run of the inning.

The Villagers scored their first run in the first inning on a base hit by Blair, a walk to Yordy, and a two-bagger by Herrell. The hitting of Ray Gardner, Bill Phoenix and Clarence Blethen featured for the Hustlers, as they combined for seven of the eight hits secured off of Fox's delivery. Phoenix had given Frederick a 4 to 1 lead in the eighth after knocking in Gardner and Blethen with a double.

Blethen tallied the Hustlers first run in the fourth. After Blethen reached on single, Phoenix sacrificed him to second, and he scored on a throwing error by Robinson. In the sixth, Blethen singled, Bill Phoenix sacrificed him to second, and he scored when Ebert threw low to first on Gosker's grounder..

*Notes* – Walkersville native Glenn Wilhide was featured in a column by *Raff.* A third year man for the United States Military Academy in West Point, NY. Wilhide was given three month's vacation by the academy, and is spending his helping the Hustlers. Glenn is also on the Army football team, and will serve as team captain going into his senior season. The American Shows, a carnival company, will show in Frederick at Freed's lot on East Patrick Street beginning next Monday. The exhibit will be under the auspices of the local Base Ball Association., with a small percentage of the receipts benefiting the Frederick Hustlers baseball club. Yordy received \$80 from the fans in the stands for his home run. He reportedly shared his new wealth with his teammates.
