Notes - From The Public Opinion, "Two Long Home Runs Help Maroons Win."

Minus the services of Manager Eddie Hooper due to an injured index finger, the Maroons took advantage of the long ball in the eighth inning to rally past Gettysburg, 4 to 2 at Wolf Park.

Former Hagerstown and Frederick hurler Abe Welcher took the mound for the Ponies and had pitched evenly with Ed Stricker, holding a 1-0 lead until the sixth when the Maroons pitcher led off by belting one of Welcher's grooves far down to the quarry in left field, and easily crossed the pan while Stein was chasing it. The ball was one of the farthest ever hit at Wolf Park.

In the eighth, the injured Hooper pinch hit for catcher Leibs, and managed to scratch out a base hit. Stricker sacrificed Hooper to second, and the Chambersburg manager scored on Bill Pedone's two-bagger. Earl Clauser then followed by belting another one of Welcher's fastballs near where Stricker's landed a few innings before, and raced around the bases, following Pedone to tally two more runs. The Ponies scored one in the ninth when Pete Bigler scored on Herman's infield out, thanks in part to a throwing error by Stricker the previous play that put Bigler in scoring position.

Abe Welcher was one of four Gettysburg hurlers who began the season with other clubs. The others were Paul Sherman (Hanover), Johnny Mumford (Martinsburg), and Harry Llewellyn (Frederick), though Llewellyn never officially appeared in a game for the Ponies.
