Notes - From The Gettysburg Times, "TWO HOME RUNS FAILED TO WIN...Bigler and Stein Come Through in Final Session but Others Cannot Produce. Kunkle Saved by Starr's Argument"

Gettysburg's ninth inning rally came up short as Hanover hung on to win a close game from the Ponies, 3 to 2, at Nixon Field on Saturday afternoon. "Pat" Kunkle had a shutout going through eight innings, as the Raiders had a 3 to 0 lead going into the final frame. Ivan "Pete" Bigler broke up the shutout bid when he hit an inside home run that rolled to the flag pole at Nixon Field, to cut the lead to two. With two out, Stein equaled "Pete's" feat with a home run of his own, to cut Hanover's lead to just one run, but thanks to Hanover Manager Billy Starr's pestering Umpire Pat Rollins about the play, it allowed Kunkle to regain his composure and held tight, and retired the next batter to end the game. \

Hanover scored all their runs in the fourth inning off started "Lefty" Baker. Jimmie Cook singled and took second when Art Koehler threw to Boyne at first, in an attempt to pick him off. Starr sacrificed the runner to third, and Cooks scored on Ben Spencer's single. Rooney was passed, and the two pulled a double steal, both scoring moments later when Jimmy Caddin slammed a double into the swamp.

Defensive plays were also featured, as Hanover shortstop Ned Crowder made a game saving catch off Herman's line drive, preventing two potential runs from scoring. In the seventh, with men in scoring position, Hanover's Cook hit a "wizzer five feet over Artie Herman's head. The (Ponies) captain leap into the air, stabbed the ball with his gloved hand, and cut off a pair of runs.

Notes - Chambersburg's Directors released pitcher "Doc" Milliman from the club. Milliman, a popular player, had lost a recent game when he dropped the ball in the ninth inning, resulting in a balk that forced in the winning run for Hagerstown. Hanover pitcher George Holbig was also released.
