Notes - From The Star and Sentinels, "FOURTH STRAIGHT GAME IS DROPPED TO MARTINSBURG...Herrell, Ex-Hagerstown Twirler, Knock to All Corners of Lot and Champs Annex 8-1 Victory - Locals Tied For Cellar."

Finney Kelly tossed a five hitter, and "Country" Morris belted a three-run home run in the fifth inning to lead Martinsburg to an easy 8 to 1 victory over visiting Gettysburg at Rosemont Park on Friday afternoon.

Walt Herrell, the former Hagerstown pitcher, was given a try-out by Manager Ira Plank for the Patriots, but was knocked freely by the Champs, allowing 12 hits on eight runs.

Martinsburg scored a run in the first when Roy Durborrow led off with a single, was sacrificed to second by Burt Shipley, and scored on Donnelly's base hit. The Champs added two more runs in the fourth with Donnelly and Reggie Rawlings reached on base hits, and both scored on the first of two doubles by George "Stuffy" Johnson.

Martinsburg jumped on Herrell in the fifth, with two out Donnelly and Rawlings both singled, and Morris crushed a Herrell delivery deep into centerfield for a three-run home run. Johnson doubled off the rattled Patriot, and Robert Zachary walked. "Stuffy" scored when third baseman Hall misplayed "Skeeter" Hayes' hard grounder, and Zachary came across on Finney Kelly bloop single.

Gettysburg could only muster one run off Kelly, when Jim Mahaffie ripped a three-bagger in the sixth inning, and scored on Plank's sacrifice fly.

Notes - Walter Pounce and William Stroh were both released by Chambersburg, and returned to their homes in Syracuse, NY. Charles Snell, a former Southern Association catcher was signed by the Maroons. Juanita College star, "Pete" Bigler and "Benny" Williams arrived in Gettysburg, and traveled to Martinsburg in time to ready to play in Saturday's game.
