Notes - From The Public Opinion, "CLAUSER COMES THRU WITH TWO BEAUTIES AND TERRIERS TRIP."

Ed Stricker fanned ten batters, and Earl Clauser had two timely hits, as Chambersburg defeated Hagerstown, 4 to 1 in a rain soaked contest at Wolf Park on Tuesday evening.

After walking Charley Dysert to start off the game, Stricker fanned Les Bangs, Jack Hurley and Bill Phoenix in succession to end the first inning. In the second, Stricker issued passes to "Polly" Speraw and John Doherty, and threw a wild pitch, putting runners in scoring position with none out, but despite loading the bases with another free pass to Earl Howard, got out of the inning by inducing Dysert to ground out.

Bangs led off the third with a base hit, and took second on a sacrifice by Hurley. Phoenix hit a roller to short, but Fuhrey's throw to third was late, and all the runners were safe. Phoenix swiped second, and Speraw was walked. Doherty whiffed, McCleary forced in a run with a free pass, and Dempsey grounded out to the pitcher to end the inning.

Chambersburg responded with two out in the fourth, "Bugs" Snyder and Karl Kolseth were both issued free passes by Howard, and Eddie Hooper filled the bags with a dribbler to the mound that the Terriers pitcher could not pick up in time. On a full count, Clauser came through with a dandy single to left the scored Snyder and Kolseth on a hit-run play, giving the Maroons a 2 to 1 lead. Hooper tried to steal home, but was tagged out.

With two out in the sixth, Snyder ripped a double to right-center, and Kolseth walked. Hooper registered a base hit to left, and Snyder scored. Clauser repeated his efforts again with another timely base hit, and Kolseth scored the Maroons fourth and final run.

Notes – Hagerstown's team was hurting, as "Monk" Walter was suspended earlier in the week, Bangs and Speraw were limping badly, and Milliman was out with a bad thumb, while Weeden was out for the season with various injuries. "The grounds were very slippery. Shavings and dirt were used to fill up the worst places and neither team took fielding practice in order that the grounds would not be cut up before the actual playing began." Umpire Marks caused a commotion in the eighth, as the skies has darkened, when he tried to call the game with only two outs when McCleary was hit by a batted ball. The game resumed, and Howard fanned to end the contest, which was called after the eighth inning.
