## Notes - From The Martinsburg Journal, "In First Place Again."

Marvin Goodwin continued his mastery over Blue Ridge League batters as he shutout Hanover in a 6 to 0 victory at McAllister Field on Friday evening. The Mountaineers needed only six hits, thanks in part to 10 walks and a league record, five wild pitches by the Raiders' Joe "Benny" Benson, who was evidently having trouble finding the strike zone all day long, and six Raiders errors.

The Mountaineers tallied twice in the second when John Bates reached on an error, and "Country" Morris walked, both scoring on a triple by Lu Blue.

In the seventh, Lee Percy doubled, and Reggie Rawlings singled. After Bates fanned, Morris received a free pass to load the bases. Blue also took four wide ones, forcing Percy across the plate for Martinsburg's third run. "Stuffy" Johnson went out to end the inning.

Two more scores came across in the eighth. Goodwin walked, and Long also received a free pass. Dean followed with a free pass to fill the bases. Percy singled to score Goodwin, but Long was forced out at home on Rawlings' fielder's choice. Bates followed with another fielder's choice that forced Dean at the plate, but Morris was hit by a pitch to force in Percy with Martinsburg's fifth run. The inning ended when Bates was picked off third, straying to far from the base.

Martinsburg added a run in the ninth when Blue walked, stole second and third, and scored on a throwing error by catcher Stroh. Notes - Hagerstown's Earl Howard tossed a no-hitter at Nixon Field, as Hagerstown blanked host Gettysburg, 4 to 0 in a regulation, nineinning game. Howard walked two batters, and fanned seven in the shut-out victory. A brief story was told of Martinsburg recent trip to Gettysburg, when a fan traveling with the team stated that the entire traveling party was stopped at the Pennsylvania state line because of an outbreak of infantile paralysis. Though Manager Morris stated that all of his party was over 16 years of age, one of his younger players caught the eye of one of the policemen, and they were briefly detained.
