From The Public Opinion, "Baseball Interest Tightens as Maroons Return as Leaders" Ed Stricker shutout Hagerstown, 5 to 0 in a crucial game at Wolf Park on Thursday evening. Stricker, who pitched the Maroons to a victory the previous day, held the Terriers to four scattered hits, as the Maroons climbed out of second place into the pole position for good, with just four games left to play in the 1916 season.

The Maroons scored twice in the third. James "Bugs" Snyder poled a double to right, and Earl Clauser moved him to third on a single past the outstretched arms of second baseman, Bill Phoenix. A botched hit and run, allowed Clauser to reach second on a throwing error by catcher "Doc" Milliman, and Snyder to third. Eddie Hooper knocked both runners home on a single to right.

Two more runs crossed in the fifth. Snyder reached on a bloop single, as Dysert was playing too far back to catch it. Clauser bunted, and pitcher McCleary fielded the ball, but threw the sphere into the bleachers along the first base line for a two-base error, allowing "Bugs" to score. Hooper sacrificed the runner to third, and Clauser scored on Karl Kolseth's fielder's choice, when Earl slid under the tag at the plate. Kolseth was caught over running the bag at second and was easily tagged out.

Chambersburg scored an insurance run in the eighth when George Pedone doubled, and scored on Bill Pownall's base hit.

Notes – Hagerstown outfielder Les Bangs was unable to play due to an injured ankle, and was replaced in the lineup by Sammy Freeney. Hurley walked in the fourth, and Bill Dempsey was allowed to run for him, but was stranded at second base. Maroons catcher Alex Schaufele came down sick, and was feared he may not be able to play the next game, so the Chambersburg Directors contacted his brother Allan, who catches for the Maryland Athletic League, after finding out that Eddie Moore was unable to replace the ill catcher. Another catcher named Kingsley phoned to say he would be here, coming from his home in Philadelphia.
